- In addition to the Graduate School Admission requirements, applicants must submit:
 - A letter of intent describing reasons for pursuing a masters' degree in education, professional goals as a participant in the program, and possible research interests.
 - Three recommendations from former instructors or employers who can judge the applicant's aptitude for graduate study.
- Applicants must hold a North Carolina Class A teaching license, or a comparable license from another state.
