### Other Requirements

A minimum of 30 hours must be earned at WCU in Junior/Senior (300/400) level courses; 50% of the credits earned in the major must be at the Junior/Senior (300/400) level.
The baccalaureate degree requires the successful completion of a minimum of 120 hours.
A minimum GPA of <b>2.0</b> is required in the <i>major</i> for graduation. <b>The major consists of the Business Core courses as well as courses in the major program of study.</b>
An overall minimum GPA of 2.0 is required to graduate.
At least 45 hours are required for enrollment in all College of Business courses numbered 300 or above.
In addition to the coursework above, Liberal Studies requirements must be met. The existing comprehensive articulation agreement enables North Carolina community college graduates of a two-year <b>associate-in-arts (AA)</b> or <b>associate-in-science (AS)</b> degree programs to transfer to constituent institutions of the University of North Carolina with junior status, having Liberal Studies requirements waived.

<b>Upper Level Perspective</b>	<b>NO EQUIVALENT</b>

Under the existing Articulation Agreement with the NCCC System, NC Community College graduates of an A.A. (Associate in Arts) or A.S. (Associate in Science) degree, will transfer into WCU with their Liberal Studies (along with the Upper-Level Perspective) waived. Graduates with any other degree MUST satisfy the Liberal Studies program with either transfer credit or WCU courses.

Only work passed with a grade of C or better will be accepted for transfer. WCU course credits awarded through transfer cannot exceed the actual number earned credit hours in a course.
