Dean's Report:

- Enrollment (UG/G) Kim shared Point in Time data. CEAP only academic college that did not decline. Most of the gaps have been closing in programs as well.
- Funding Model The BOG will be changing and voting on a new Funding Model for the UNC System. Currently the only way to get more money is to grow enrollment. Looking at outdated factors. More intuitive. Tuition not a factor. Incremental funding model. Performance weighted (SCHs). Heavily undergraduate focused. "Performance" metrics for WCU not yet shared. Uses Delaware Cost data and Carnegie classification. Summer will now be included. Proposed to start this coming fall. Kim will send PowerPoint to those who are interested in diving deeper. NC Promise fully funded. Discussion ensued.
- Covid Updates Check in. Lots of interns impacted. Struggle with student attendance and engagement. Grace v. Expectation. Access to multiple masks is available to interns and clinical programs.
